We are offering you the opportunity to shape the future of your environment, identifying where homes should go and how they should look.

We will also provide our mature woodlands, peaceful lakes and beautiful parklands, making them accessible for residents of all ages.

The Knowle Park Initiative is a collaboration between local landowners and local people, with a vision to deliver a sustainable long-term future for Cranleigh.

About Cranleigh

Cranleigh has a population of around 13,000 people. We have many distinctive assets, great schools, good restaurants and pubs, a diverse high street, play and sporting facilities.

We have a very strong community spirit with over 75 local interest groups. The market, on a Thursday, is one of the most popular in the county, attracting thousands of people every week.

The reality is that there is a dire need for homes for first time buyers in Cranleigh to cater for the children and grandchildren of local residents who wish to live here.

Young people and families have been forced to move out of the village. Based on current waiting lists it would take 45 years to get an Affordable Home allocated in our area.

Cranleigh High Street has experienced a downturn over recent years with independent retailers now struggling to survive; some already forced to close are now occupied by Charity shops, leaving others standing empty.

New homes, within walking and cycling distance from the shops, will invigorate the High Street and the local economy.













The Site



Knowle Park and West Cranleigh nurseries is a site in excess of 100 acres, a significant part of which is a brownfield site currently occupied by horticultural glasshouses and associated buildings. It stretches from the south of Cranleigh High Street westwards towards Elmbridge Road.

This unique piece of land has distinctive areas; brownfield which is suitable for the building of new homes, adjacent to areas of stunning natural beauty which we wish to preserve for the benefit and enjoyment of all.

Opportunities

Our vision is to work with you for the benefits of all concerned. This vision currently includes:



Homes for first time buyers, helping young people onto the housing ladder



Space for larger gardens and opportunities to extend as the need arises



Homes for 'down-sizers' freeing up larger houses elsewhere in the village



Opportunities for self-build encouraging choice, design and individuality



Sporting facilities, football pitches, play areas and communal parkland



Footpaths and cycle ways connecting areas across Cranleigh



Mature woodland, parkland, waterways



Water management, green new and existing lakes and infrastructure and new wildlife habitat

We want to make this a place where people can settle and nurture their families without having to move. Giving the capacity for people to extend their own homes within existing plots of land makes possible the long-term sustainability of our community.




















One of the major benefits offered by our location is that the new homeowners will not need to access the high street by car in order for the evolved areas to function. Here are some questions to consider:
